### ILS BLOG - TIPS FOR CULTIVATING CREATIVITY IN YOUR KIDS

There's a common misconception that the best way to encourage children's creativity is simply to get out of the way and let them be creative. Although it's certainly true that children are naturally curious and inquisitive, they need support to develop their creative capacities and reach their full creative potential. Supporting children's development is always a balancing act: how much structure, how much freedom; when to step in, when to step back; when to show, when to tell, when to ask, when to listen. The key challenge is not how to "teach" creativity to children, but rather how to create a fertile environment in which their creativity will take root, grow, and flourish.

#### **IMAGINE**

#### 1. Show examples to spark ideas

A blank page, a blank canvas, and a blank screen can be intimidating. A collection of examples can help spark the imagination. We can always start by showing sample projects — to give a sense of what's possible (inspirational projects) and to provide ideas on how to get started (starter projects). We can show a diverse range of projects, in hopes of connecting with the interests and passions of workshop participants.

Of course, there's a risk that children will simply mimic or copy the examples that they see. That's OK as a start, but only as a start. Encourage them to change or modify the examples. What is important is: What might they do differently? How can they add their own style, connect to their own interests? How can they make it their own?



#### 2. Encourage messing around

Most people assume that imagination takes place in the head, but the hands are just as important. To help children generate ideas for projects, we often encourage them to start messing around with materials. As children play with LEGO bricks or tinker with craft materials, new ideas emerge. What started as an aimless activity becomes the beginning of an extended project.

We can sometimes organize mini hands-on activities to get children started. For example, we can ask children to put a few LEGO bricks together, then pass the structure to a friend to add a few more, then continue back and forth. After a few repetitions, children often have new ideas for things they want to build.

Messing in a small kitchen garden or having to plant some saplings and look after them is also a fun activity. Scientists have discovered that the mycobacterium found in soil can improve brain functions while boosting moods. The mycobacterium vaccae found in the soil increases serotonin produced in the brain (also known as the "happy" chemical). By getting your hands dirty, you're also making your brain happy! It is not only fun, but it is also a healthy activity that helps children to improve their motor skills, social skills, and knowledge of plants, insects, and other living things. It also helps them to learn about responsibility and to develop persistence in the face of challenges. Their curiosity is stimulated, they ask questions and instinctively solve problems. They feel ownership of the space they are cultivating and pride in their work.

### 3. Provide a wide variety of materials

Children are deeply influenced by the toys, tools and materials in the world around them. To engage children in creative activities, make sure they have access to a broad diversity of materials for drawing, building and crafting. New technologies, like robotics kits and 3-D printers, can expand the range of what children create but don't overlook traditional materials like natural vegetable colours, vegetable blocks for printing etc. The greater the diversity of materials, the greater the opportunity for creative projects.

### 4. Embrace all types of making

Different children are interested in different types of making. Some enjoy making houses and castles with LEGO bricks. Some enjoy making games and animations with Scratch. Others enjoy making jewellery or soapbox race cars or desserts —or miniature golf courses.

Writing a poem or a short story is a type of making, too. Children can learn about the creative design process through all of these activities. Help children find the type of making that resonates for them. Even better: Encourage children to engage in multiple types of making. That way, they'll get an even deeper understanding of the creative design process.

### PLAY

### 5. Emphasize process, not product

Many of the best learning experiences happen when people are actively engaged in making things, but that doesn't mean we should put all our attention on the things that are made. Even more important is the process through which things are made. As children work on projects, highlight the process, not just the final product. Ask children about their strategies and their sources of inspiration. Encourage experimentation by honouring failed experiments as much as successful ones. Allocate time for children to share the intermediate stages of their projects and discuss what they plan to do next and why.

### REFLECT

### 6. Ask (authentic) questions.

It's great for children to immerse themselves in projects, but it's also important for them to step back to reflect on what's happening. You can encourage children to reflect by asking them questions about their projects. We often start by asking: "How did you come up with the idea for this project?" It's an authentic question: I really want to know! The question prompts them to reflect on what motivated and inspired them.

Another of my favourite questions: "What's been most surprising to you?" This question pushes them away from just describing the project and toward reflecting on their experience. If something goes wrong with a project, we will often ask: "What did you want it to do?" In describing what they were trying to do, they often recognize where they went wrong, without any further input from us.

### 7. Share your own reflections.

Most parents and teachers are reluctant to talk with children about their own thinking processes. But talking with children about your own thinking process is the best gift you could give them.

It's important for children to know that thinking is hard work for everyone—for adults as well as children. And it's useful for children to hear your strategies for working on projects and thinking through problems. By hearing your reflections, children will be more open to reflecting on their own thinking, and they'll have a better model of how to do it.

Be Creative, Encourage Creativity!

Times have changed, and so have expectations! To keep in sync with the fast-paced world we must prepare our learners with known skills for an unknown future. These values go beyond the knowledge found in books and encompass the learning that includes understanding oneself. Yes, a task accomplished only by spending time in introspection and honing the skills that may seem trivial but are of utmost importance. Fortunately, it is possible to understand oneself and others, and this is what Social Emotional Learning is all about. We perceive this need and are delighted to share that we have taken steps to include this concept in our curriculum during the Holistic Learning and Development sessions.

A month into this new learning, and it is great to see that our learners have accepted the new curriculum with open arms and make an effort to display behaviour in sync with the core components of Self-Management, Self-Awareness, Social Awareness, Responsible Decision Making and Relationship Skills. Like any other skill, total acquisition may take some time, but we are confident that with a strong foundation and continuous reinforcement at home and school, they will be empowered to meet the challenges of the 21st century, rise above all adversaries and shine bright.
